*T*hank you all for another great season even though Covid and the weather put up a big fight. In true Palmy Spirit, we put our heads down and got on with the job of protecting our beaches.

We started the season with a new Constitution (long overdue) which was led by Anna Carroll, our Secretary, who spent a lot of time researching best practices in Surf Life Saving Clubs. This has enabled us to conduct our business much more efficiently throughout the season. We now have an Operations Committee who have been able to focus on their core business of patrols, nippers, training, youth development and surf sports, and a Board responsible for finance, governance and compliance, maintaining our building and property, strategic planning, managing our staff and liaising with our Supporters Club.



I would like to recognise our Supporters Club for the contributions they have made to the Surf Lifesaving Club in what has been a difficult trading season due to the effect of Covid and the extreme weather. It is not only the cash donation but also the support given to our administration team by the General Manager and his amazing team that is really appreciated. It is also noted that without the generous support of our two major sponsors, Cru Collective and Usher, over the last three seasons we would not be in the sound financial position we are in.

#### Patrols:

Our new Club Captain and his team have done an exemplary job fielding compliant patrols throughout the season even though Covid and the inclement weather conspired against them. He has managed over 220 volunteers and kept our beach fatality-free. What a great effort. This season we have added two new IRBs and a trailer to our fleet as well as four new rescue boards, a defib, and upgraded 8 manikins to provide interactive training for our students.

#### Nippers:

We also had a new Junior Activities Officer (JAC) this season who brought a jam-packed agenda with him and also a bit of cheeky fun. He and his team inspired a sizeable increase in parent volunteer involvement within the junior club. He has also encouraged our cadets to stay on and assist in areas such as age managing and mentoring of younger members by buddying them up with the younger kids. He has set the bar high with a junior presentation day that was worthy of a run at the West End.

#### Training:

The Chief Training Officer and her team have delivered an impressive 230 awards this season which includes 42 bronze and 17 SRC to name a couple. Through her mentoring, the team now has two more trainers and a couple more going through in the off-season. They also collaborated with neighbouring club Tallebudgera to deliver 13 IRB crewie and 5 IRB driver awards which were desperately needed.

#### Surf Sports:

An inspiring season led by our new Surf Sports Officer who did an amazing job getting his coaching accreditation at the start of the season. The coaching program was inclusive from Nippers through to Masters and had a very successful season despite interruptions from Covid. It also included the appointment of Ky Hurst as Head Coach for the season.

#### Youth Development:

Our Youth Development Officers did a cracking job with our youth this season. The cadets participated in a range of activities throughout the season and loved it all. This awesome effort culminated in the Club coming Runner Up in the Gold Coast Youth Development Club of the Year. Congratulations and well done team.

Thank you to our amazing office staff who this year have gone above and beyond, even while working out of the training room while their office is out of action. Thank you for your commitment and dedication to our Club. Also, a big shoutout to our Branch Administrator and the Board for all their assistance throughout the season.

Importantly, a very big thank you to David Collins, our outgoing Treasurer, who has been instrumental in setting up a very solid foundation for our Club, implementing strategic planning, governance, improving the overall financial position of the Club, and introducing a range of initiatives that have truly set the Club up for long-term sustainability.

Lastly a HUGE thanks to all our members who make our club such an awesome club to be involved in. Looking forward to hanging with you all next season.

Firstly, I would like to acknowledge Mary Farrell for the honour she placed on me when she asked me to take up the role of Club Captain.

I would also like to acknowledge Tim Matchett and his stewardship in the role and acknowledge his contribution, not only as Club Captain but also as part of the greater Palmy community. He contributed heavily through nippers, with the involvement of his three sons, as Age Manager, also as Sprint Coach for several years, and finally as a Masters competitor and motivator.

None of what we do as a club is possible without teamwork and I would like to acknowledge Mary and both club Boards. The structure that has been built over several years enables all aspects of the club to function as one.

None of the systems in place are any good unless they are managed and maintained by our dedicated administrators Jenny, Sue and Gab who I would also like to acknowledge. They always manage to keep us on track facilitating the day-to-day including finances and fee collection, coordination of training, calendars and Board deadlines and meeting coordination amongst many other functions. The club has a great structure and governance in place and can safely maintain its ongoing integrity.

Club Captain is a position that relies on all aspects of the club community including First Aid Officer Sharon Finucan who always has our first aid room and arena checked and well stocked for all patrol endeavours. Even though Sharon lives in Brisbane, she is at the club not only for rostered patrols but plenty of voluntary patrols too. To add extra responsibility, Sharon also assists with club patrol inspections at a Branch level. Nick Perugino also assists in these inspections, as a Palm Beach representative along with his dual responsibilities as Gear Steward and as Club Vice Captain. The arena trailer, tractor and SSV seldom skip a beat due to his commitment. I also know personally that if we are short on a patrol, he is only a phone call away at short notice. Next and by no means any less important is Ben Tidey our IRB Officer is faultless in his endeavour to keep our rescue craft including boats, motors, and trailers ticking along as we need them to be, week in and week out. Along with responsibilities for maintaining compliance for statutory bodies such as Maritime Services QLD. He's also been very quick to assist in providing advice for maintenance, or repair for other plant and equipment where needed. Ben has also made himself available to assist on patrol as IRB Driver or Crew if needed and has most recently undertaken the can laying course to assist with this at nippers.

As a club, our patch of the Gold Coast coastline continues to expand with unprecedented growth coming from regegrification and new development. This will increase further soon with the completion of the M1 at its closest point to the coast, at Palmy, and further, as light rail comes to town, like it or hate it.

With all these factors coupled with our uniqueness in having Saturday nippers and being driven by a third generation of enthusiasm at our JAC level, Palmy as a club should continue to grow. None of this would be possible without the next level of enthusiasm from Josh Sealey our current JAC. In his first season, and without diminishing the efforts of Zelda and Gary before him, we should commend the increase in family involvement and uptake, from mum's and dad's participation, with multiple age managers per age group, up to three and four in some age groups and with all age groups filled at the end of year general meeting. It would also seem there has also been an increased uptake from families in areas of water safety, along with senior nippers and parents completing Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) and water safety courses respectively. Parent participation is essential to enable Palmy to be competitive at Club, Branch, State, and Aussie levels. Nobody can compete without the club fulfilling its obligations to keep our nipper, open, and master's competitors safe in the water and on the beach.

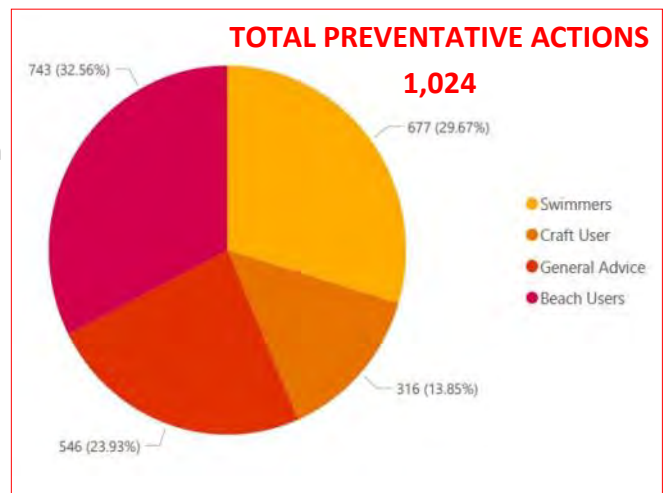
As Club Captain, the importance of the club maintaining depth across all facets of life saving has never been more apparent. Through the continued support of the admin team, the Operations Committee and the Board, the identification of weaknesses in our patrol body is critical. Through the continued revision of the patrol group makeup, it becomes more apparent that training is probably the most critical part of maintaining our commitments to lifesaving and competitor safety.

The club has been blessed with the uptake of the Chief Training Officer (CTO) role being filled by Donna Riley, now in her second season. Donna has a wealth of experience as an educator, and those professional skills are translating to club members receiving the best possible opportunities to fulfill both their own and the club's needs in supporting our competitors, and ultimately our lifesaving commitments. Since before the start of the current season, there have been numerous opportunities for existing patrolling members, and new nipper families to take advantage of what's on offer, build their skills, and continue to build the required depth, for the club's patrol groups. These opportunities will continue throughout the offseason to further develop the depth of abilities in key areas across the patrol groups including IRB Drivers and Crew, Advanced Resuscitation (ART), and Silver Medallions, to train further patrol group leaders, and to backfill patrol captains, who may be absent throughout the season.

The other integral positions in the club that must be acknowledged are the team of Patrol Captains who ensure that our patrol groups have strong and dedicated leadership. This has been demonstrated, time and again, throughout the season with all making themselves available to backup teammates, who may not have been available for reasons, including serious injury, rostered paid shifts, and serious illness just to mention a few. We have also had other Patrol Captains resign through the season, I would like to acknowledge Luke Opray for backfilling as Patrol Captain for the remainder of the season and he may put his hand up to fill the role next season. We have also had club veterans Zelda and Wayne Jennings put their hands up to complete the Silver Medallion along with plenty of others to build the PC depth.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge and thank every patrolling member who turns up on our beach to keep the punters safe. Without all of you, the club could not function and fulfill its obligations to keep our community safe.

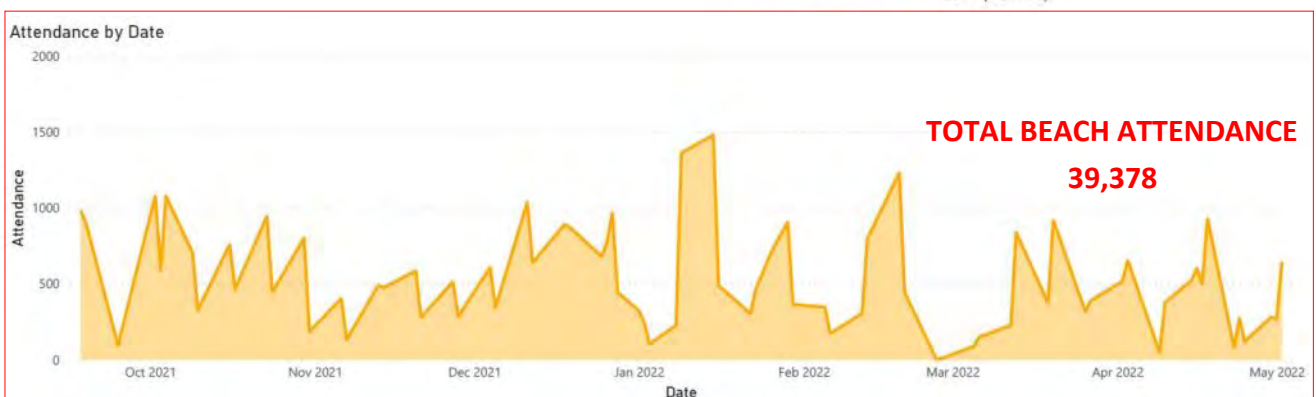
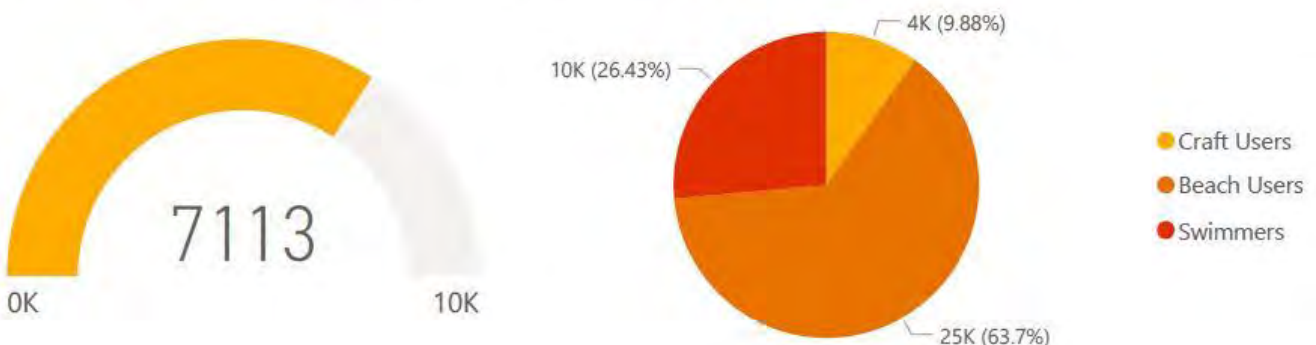

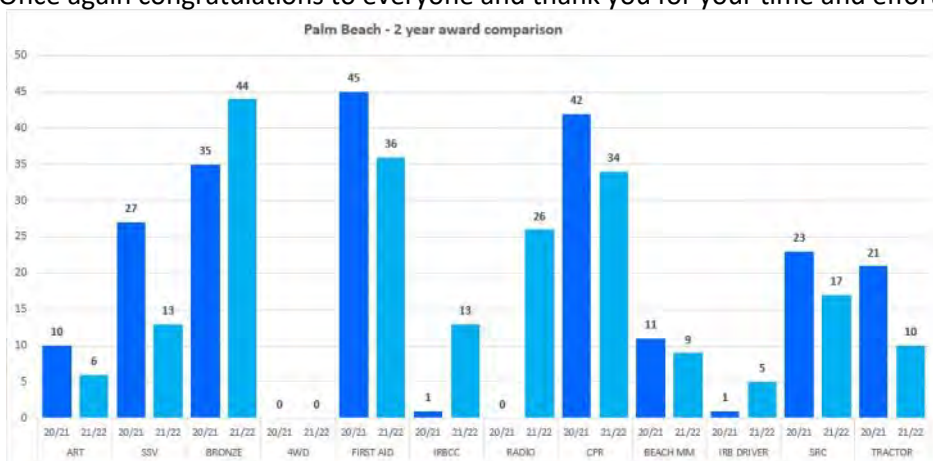

We continue to apply for all relevant grants knowing every dollar is being invested to administer and run Palm Beach's programs. Thank you to all those that have supported our efforts through the past season.

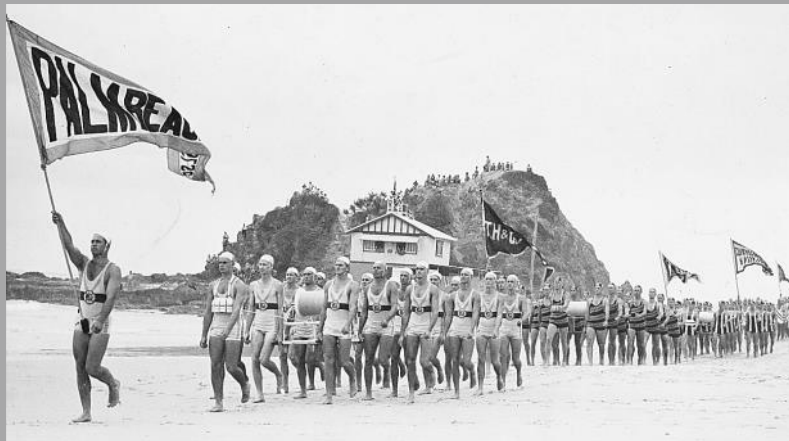

Keith was born on 26/03/1926 and passed away peacefully at the age of 95. His life was celebrated at his funeral service on 30/07/2021.

This makes him one of the fledgling members of Palm Beach SLSC which had its origins in 1930. In fact, he joined the Club on 01/09/1943 and obtained his Bronze Medallion on 03/01/1944.

“Scotchy”, (not sure till now how he got the nickname but nobody ever remembered him wearing a kilt in the Clubhouse) served as an active member for many years alongside companions like Maurie Webb, Andy Frizzell who served as President for 22 successive years and one later, the Aldridge boys, Ken Francis, Rob Mc Pherson, “Chuck” Allen-Waters, “Spider” Webb, Leo Asimov, Alan Gray ( Boat Captain 7 successive years) and many other legends of the developing Club. These Boys and others followed the tent accommodation with a shed and then a “new clubhouse”, all contributing their labour as well as performing their Beach duties. No doubt, Scotchie’s extensive career in the electrical game was put to good use. In those days you hitched down, hid in the milk train to Elanora siding, bummed or shared a lift and stayed the full weekend in the Club digs. You paid your “accommodation” with all sorts of extra duties besides normal patrols. Local trips were sometimes also arranged free by climbing onto the roof luggage racks of the local bus service. Scotchy formed part of this pioneer group for many years where mateship bonds were made for life. He also helped promote the first “Old Boys” association of the Club which thrived for many years and has re emerged several times in the years since then.

Most members of the day also competed at Surf Carnivals. As part of a Palm Beach Senior boat crew he took out a State Title in the 49-50 season, and also cut a fine figure in the traditional March Past Team at many a carnival. Always the loyal and caring member, willing to contribute whenever called to do so.

As a matter of fact, Scotchy was awarded his prestigious Life Membership much to the delight and pride of his wife Pauline in the 1960-1961 season. Following his active life in the Club, he and Pauline continued their long Club association to almost the date of Keith’s passing. He never forgot the Club and the lifelong friends the pair gathered along the way and Keith and Pauline rarely missed an Annual Dinner or Past Members get together to catch up on the news.

To further define the man his coffin was adorned with the appropriate Scottish kilt and the blue-white-sky of the Palm Beach Qld. Competition cap.

The Spirit, Drive and Enthusiasm of members like Keith are what helped to make the Palm Beach of today, a legacy for us to continue.

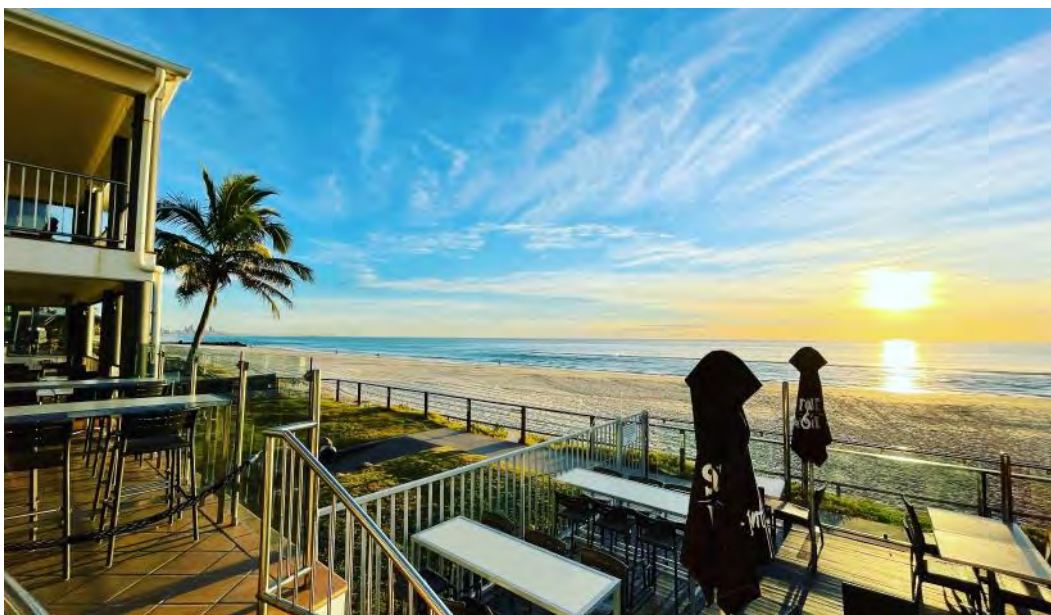

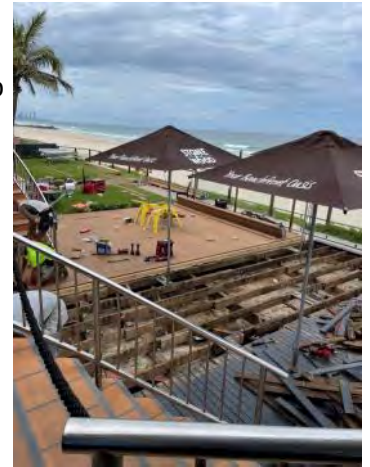

### Notes to the Financial Statements

The financial statements cover Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (QLD) (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020).

The functional and presentation currency of Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

#### 1 Basis of Preparation

The Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

##### **New and amended Australian Accounting Standards that are effective for the current year**

The Association has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) that are relevant to its operations and effective for an accounting period that begins on or after 1 July 2020.

New and revised Standards and amendments thereof and Interpretations effective for the current year that are relevant to the Association include:

- AASB 2018-7 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Definition of Material

##### AASB 2018-7 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Definition of Material

This Standard amends AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements* and AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, and makes consequential amendments to several other pronouncements and publications. The Association has adopted these amendments for the first time in the current year. The amendments make the definition of material in AASB 101 easier to understand and are not intended to alter the underlying concept of materiality in Australian Accounting Standards. The concept of 'obscuring' material information with immaterial information has been included as part of the new definition.

The threshold for materiality influencing users has been changed from 'could influence' to 'could reasonably be expected to influence'. The definition of material in AASB 108 has been replaced by a reference to the definition of material in AASB 101. In addition, the Standard also amends other Australian Accounting Standards and the Conceptual Framework that contain a definition of 'material' or refer to the term 'material' to ensure consistency.

##### **New and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations on issue but not yet effective**

The Board have assessed that all other new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations on issue but not yet effect will not impact the association. The Board will consider if any of the recommended changes to the disclosure of accounting policies included in the new standards may benefit the financial statements and consider amendment at a later date.

### 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised, as the club is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (b) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

#### (c) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

##### Land and buildings

Land and buildings are measured using the revaluation model.

##### Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

##### Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

Freehold land is not depreciated. The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

#### **2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

##### **(d) Operating lease**

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all of the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses on a straight-line basis over the life of the lease term.

#### **3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The Board make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

##### **Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment**

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

##### **Key estimates - useful life of fixed assets**

The Association reviews its estimate of the useful life of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

##### **Key estimates - provision**

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

##### **Key estimates - receivables**

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

##### **Key estimates - inventories**

The Association reviews its estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.





### Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2022

The financial statements cover Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc as an individual entity. Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (QLD) (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020).

The functional and presentation currency of Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

#### 1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

#### New and amended Australian Accounting Standards that are effective for the current year

The Association has adopted all of the new and revised Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) that are relevant to its operations and effective for an accounting period that begins on or after 1 July 2020.

New and revised Standards and amendments thereof and Interpretations effective for the current year that are relevant to the Association include:

- AASB 2018-7 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Definition of Material

#### AASB 2018-7 Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Definition of Material

This Standard amends AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements* and AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, and makes consequential amendments to several other pronouncements and publications. The Association has adopted these amendments for the first time in the current year. The amendments make the definition of material in AASB 101 easier to understand and are not intended to alter the underlying concept of materiality in Australian Accounting Standards. The concept of 'obscuring' material information with immaterial information has been included as part of the new definition.

The threshold for materiality influencing users has been changed from 'could influence' to 'could reasonably be expected to influence'. The definition of material in AASB 108 has been replaced by a reference to the definition of material in AASB 101. In addition, the Standard also amends other Australian Accounting Standards and the Conceptual Framework that contain a definition of 'material' or refer to the term 'material' to ensure consistency.

#### New and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations on issue but not yet effective

The committee have assessed that all other new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations on issue but not yet effect will not impact the association. The committee will consider if any of the recommended changes to the disclosure of accounting policies included in the new standards may benefit the financial statements and consider amendment at a later date.

### **2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### **(a) Income Tax**

The Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 provides that under the concept of mutuality clubs are only liable for income tax on income derived from non-members and from outside entities.

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income) and deferred tax expense (income).

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at the end of the reporting year. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

#### **(b) Goods and services tax (GST)**

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

#### **(c) Property, plant and equipment**

##### **Plant and equipment**

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

##### **Depreciation**

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

### **2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### **(d) Operating leases**

The Association lease land, building and improvements for period up to 10 years. Lease contracts may contain both lease and non-lease components. The Association allocates the consideration in the contract to the lease and non-lease components based on their relative stand-alone price. Lease terms are negotiated on an individual basis and contain a wide range of different terms and conditions. The lease agreements do not impose any covenants other than the security interest in the leased asset that are held by the lessor. Leased assets may not be used as security for borrowings purposes.

The Association has elected IT equipment and other plant and equipment meeting the criteria of low-value assets are recognised as such. Leases of low-value assets and payments relating to short-term leases (leases with a less term of 12 months or less) are recognised on a straight-line basis as an expense.

Right-of-use assets are measured at cost comprising the following:

- the amount of the initial measurement lease liability;
- any lease payment made at or before the commencement date less any lease incentive received;
- any initial direct costs and,
- restoration costs.

Right-of-use are depreciated over the shorter of the asset's useful life and the lease term on a straight-line basis. If the Association is reasonably certain to exercise a purchase option, the right-of-use asset is depreciated over the underlying asset's useful life.

Liability arising from a lease are initially measured on a present value basis. Lease liability include the net present value of the following lease payments:

- fixed payments (including in-substance fixed payments), less any lease incentives receivable;
- variable lease payment that are based on an index or a rate, initially measured using the index or rate as at the commencement date;
- amounts expected to be payable the Association under residual value guarantees;
- the exercise price of a purchase option if the Association is reasonably certain to exercise that option; and,
- payments of penalties for terminating the lease term reflects the Associations exercising that option.

### **3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The Committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

### **3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

Key estimates - impairment of intangible assets

The Association monitor the fair value of website for indication of impairment on entitlements held at cost.

Key estimates - useful life of fixed assets

The Association reviews its estimate of the useful life of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

#### **Key estimates - provisions**

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

#### **Key estimates - provisions for gaming jackpots**

The Association reviews its estimates and judgments for the methodology for the provision for gaming jackpots each reporting date. The Association judgments take 100% of the jackpot liability.

#### **Key estimates - receivables**

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

#### **Key estimates - inventories**

The Association reviews its estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.
