President's Report

Season 24/25 didn't go to plan with Cyclone Alfred, farewelling staff, change of President mid-season, and cancellation of our flagship competitions – Branch and State titles - with one too many wet and windy patrols that even the 3pm “hot chips and gravy” couldn't improve.

What did go to plan was how we rose to the occasion, and were led by our values:

- We were united in taping up windows, sandbagging and battening down the hatches
- We got involved in the office when we were short on staff and kept turning up to training, and subbing into patrol groups
- We respected mother nature and what she threw us, and the advice of our governing body not to compete even though the disappointment was great.
- We met our goal of zero preventable deaths and welcomed close to 40,000 people to Palm Beach.



President, Anna Carroll

To run a club of 900 members needs many volunteer hours and many people to put their hands up and give of their time. Nippers wouldn't be possible without Josh Sealey, Leesa Monaghan and their energetic Age Managers (with their waterproof clipboards), herding 400+ five to 14 year olds every Saturday morning - safely guided on the beach and in the water by Rohan Dredge's orange army of water safety volunteers.

Our community wouldn't be safe without Ben Tidey's coordination of 12 patrol groups and 160 patrollers; without Colin Harvey maintaining tractors, trailers, patrol arenas, spinal boards and rescue boards; and without volunteers delivering Bronze and SRC courses. Nor would we be safe without Sharon Finucan's first class first aid room and her blood kits.

Our beach wouldn't be the same without Coach Wal (Colleen Te Heu Heu Tukino), Lou Ruff and Jack Carroll's crew of clubbies who train on the sand and in the water, staying fit to compete and keep our beach safe. Thank you to each of our many members for volunteering and getting involved.

This season we created a locally grown coaching team and program. Drawing on the talent within our club to provide a program that built confidence and competence that will continue to grow in future seasons.

Partnering with AirBnB, Palm Beach Surf Club was in the spotlight with a promotion offering a weekend stay in the dorms with a surf lesson from Mick Fanning. As part of this promotion, AirBnB provided a refresh to the dorm and more significant improvements are planned with the generosity of the Queensland State Government's election commitment of \$420,000 to continue the upgrade - creating a space for members and community groups. With this funding we will also look to find safer access points onto the beach for the 400+ nippers on Saturday morning and the patrol trailer and IRB.

Working with Councillor Josh Martin, Wi-Fi has been installed in the adjoining Andy Frizzell Park aptly named SLSC – Nippers. This will improve our ability to electronically sign nippers in and out of the Saturday morning program using the LiveHeats wrist bands.

We continued to struggle to provide the education program to members who were eager to complete their Bronze Medallion and train IRB drivers and crew members. Looking to Season 25/26, this frustration is being addressed with a restructure of resources and a dedicated role for education and lifesaving.

Looking ahead we will increase the number of patrollers and grow to 14 patrol groups; widen the coaching program to provide our patrolling members with sessions to maintain their skills and fitness, and continue to lean into the passion, skills and diversity of our members.

Our long-term connection with GG Enviro continues and we welcomed Coastal as a gold sponsor for the three years. McLaughlin Lawyers continue to provide guidance and support. Thanks go to Ingwerson & Lansdown for their financial contribution, and the silent donors and supporters who have provided equipment without seeking acknowledgement; in particular Dan Stewart OAM for his annual bursary that supported our nipper program this season.

Our Supporters Club continues to provide financial support needed to keep our beaches safe, employ our life savers and working together, we are a hub for the community.

I would like to make a special mention to Greg Cox. Greg was a nipper at Palm Beach, patrol captain for patrol group 10, an accomplished competitor and gold medallion athlete, who built the sports surf program we enjoy today. Greg also loves being on the gurney at the end of season club clean-up day. Greg has been a Board member of the club since 2017 and for the last eight years has attended monthly meetings and in his calm, considered, science-based way, has represented the voice of our members and has kept us grounded in what it means to provide a community service, a place of belonging, and to be a life saver. This is Greg's last season on the Board and he has handed the baton over - but he will still be in charge of the gurney at the end of season clean-up. Thank you on behalf of the Board members that have served with you.

Finally, thanks to the Operations Committee and Board members who give of their time, advice, and skills to lead the club and continue the legacy our founding members started 95 years ago.

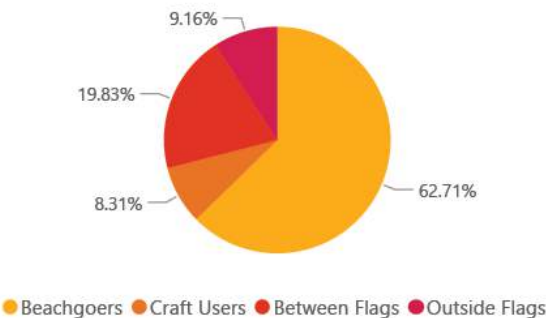

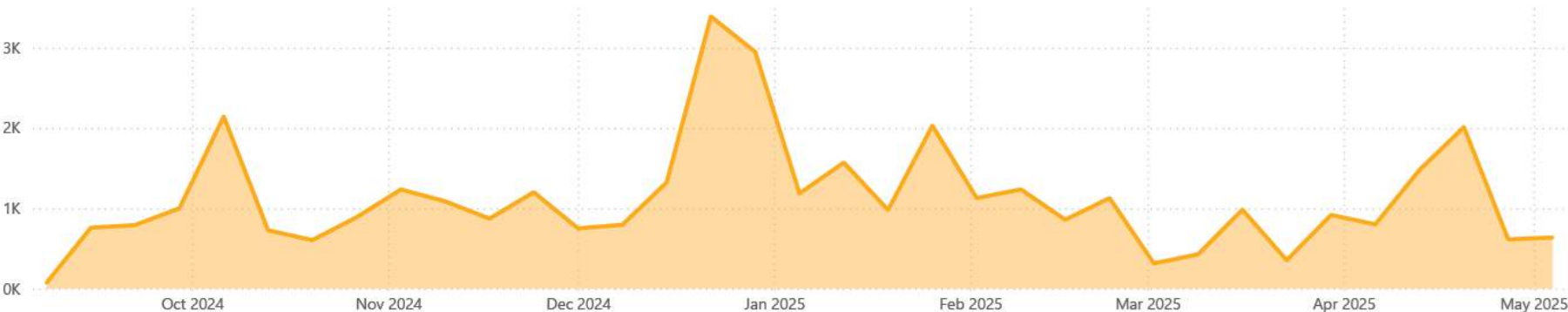

Congratulations Sam. Thank you for your dedication and service to Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club.



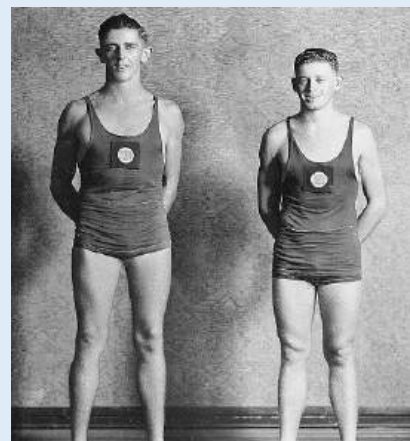

Barry Howes

10 December 1942 to 29 December 2024

[Fellow Life Member and friend Bob Stockwell shared some words about Barry taken from the eulogy he wrote for Barry's funeral]

My name is Bob Stockwell and I am a Life Member of the Palm Beach Surf Club. I extend my condolences to Cheryl, Brooke, Greer, Dahna, Ross, and their families and I consider it an honour to share my memories of Barry Howes.

Barry and his brother Ross began their sporting journey at Sandgate AFL Club, following in the footsteps of their father, Ted, a respected trainer and medical expert. Barry was a talented footballer, playing in five reserve grade grand finals and winning three premierships. Known for his tough, skilful play, he was awarded Best Player in 1966 and is remembered for his pivotal role in the 1970 first grade final.

Barry also coached junior football, inspiring many young players to join him in his other passion - surf lifesaving. This led to a tradition of Sandgate players becoming Palm Beach lifesavers, many achieving Branch and state honours.

Barry trained as a boxer and won his first professional fight in Toowoomba. However, his heart was always with the surf club. Joining Palm Beach in the early 1960s, over 30 years he served as Vice Captain, Captain, Secretary, Deputy President and President.

He played a key role in the club's refurbishment in the late 1970s and was made a Life Member in 1978.

Barry's true love was surf boat racing and training. Over 30 years, he won multiple medals, including state golds in Reserve, Senior, Junior, and Masters categories - a remarkable achievement unlikely to be repeated. I was proud to row with Barry in the 1968-69 state champion crew. Barry created lasting memories, both on and off the water, and was always a source of fun and leadership.

Barry's wife Cheryl shared that the surf club was the love of Barry's life. His commitment and leadership made him a Palm Beach legend. Surf clubs and football clubs have for a long time created a sense of belonging through mate ship, competition, and discipline that prepares young men and women for their future roles in life. These associations are Australian icons and they need great leaders. Barry Howes was a great leader and a great friend. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

The financial statements cover Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (QLD) (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020)*, and registered under Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The functional and presentation currency of Palm Beach QLD Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The committee do not expect that the adoption of the Standards listed above will have a material impact on the financial statements of the association and in the main will only impact additional disclosures in the accounting policy notes in future periods

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised, as the club is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Land and buildings

Buildings are measured using the cost model.

Freehold land is measured using the revaluation model.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

Freehold land is not depreciated. The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Board make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Key estimates - useful life of fixed assets

The Association reviews its estimate of the useful life of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

Key estimates - provision

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

Key estimates - inventories

The Association reviews its estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.

When grant revenue is received whereby the company incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Membership Income

The Association has implemented AASB 15 which requires membership income to be reported over the term of the membership due. Membership income is reported in line with the memberships useful life and subsequently apportion of membership income treated as fees in advance.

Other Income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it, which is generally at the time of receipt.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2025

The financial statements cover Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc as an individual entity. Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (QLD) (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2020).

The functional and presentation currency of Palm Beach QLD Surf Lifesaving Club Supporters Club Inc is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 provides that under the concept of mutuality clubs are only liable for income tax on income derived from non-members and from outside entities.

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income) and deferred tax expense (income).

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at the end of the reporting year. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

(b) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the cost model.

(c) Property, plant and equipment

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Plant and Equipment	20%
Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings	20%
Motor Vehicles	15-25%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(d) Operating leases

The Association leases land, building and improvements for period up to 10 years from the Surf Club. Lease contracts may contain both lease and non-lease components. The Association allocates the consideration in the contract to the lease and non-lease components based on their relative stand-alone price. Lease terms are negotiated on an individual basis and contain a wide range of different terms and conditions. The lease agreements do not impose any covenants other than the security interest in the leased asset that are held by the lessor. Leased assets may not be used as security for borrowings purposes.

The Association has elected IT equipment and other plant and equipment meeting the criteria of low-value assets are recognised as such. Leases of low-value assets and payments relating to short-term leases (leases with a less term of 12 months or less) are recognised on a straight-line basis as an expense.

Right-of-use assets are measured at cost comprising the following:

- the amount of the initial measurement lease liability;
- any lease payment made at or before the commencement date less any lease incentive received;
- any initial direct costs and,
- restoration costs.

Right-of-use are depreciated over the shorter of the asset's useful life and the lease term on a straight-line basis. If the Association is reasonably certain to exercise a purchase option, the right-of-use asset is depreciated over the underlying asset's useful life.

Liability arising from a lease are initially measured on a present value basis. Lease liability include the net present value of the following lease payments:

- fixed payments (including in-substance fixed payments), less any lease incentives receivable;

(d) Operating leases

-variable lease payment that are based on an index or a rate, initially measured using the index or rate as at the commencement date;

-amounts expected to be payable the Association under residual value guarantees;

the exercise price of a purchase option if the Association is reasonably certain to exercise that option; and,

-payments of penalties for terminating the lease term reflects the Associations exercising that option.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

Key estimates - impairment of intangible assets

The Association monitors the fair value of website for indication of impairment on entitlements held at cost.

Key estimates - useful life of fixed assets

The Association reviews its estimate of the useful life of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected life of the assets.

Key estimates - provisions

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

Key estimates - provisions for gaming jackpots

The Association reviews its estimates and judgments for the methodology for the provision for gaming jackpots each reporting date. The Association takes up 100% of the potential jackpot liability.

Key estimates - useful life of fixed assets

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

Key estimates - inventories

The Association reviews its estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.

Contingent Assets

The Association holds 50 gaming machine entitlements. The fair value of gaming machines entitlements per average price sold is \$5,363 (publication updated on ATO web site 29th October 2020). Palm Beach QLD Surf life Saving Club Supporters Club Inc total contingent asset is estimated at \$268,150.

The club has entered into an insurance claim with the insurance provider whereby there is an expectation the supporters club are to receive insurance recovering income for the damaged incurred from the Cyclone Event in March 2025. At present no such income has been received. We draw attention to the reader to note that the increase in repairs and maintenance in the current year audit has been impacted by such event.
